




Generating Reports

3. Go to YCIS SH RP, and choose the report you'd like to generate.







He has a good recall of multiplication fact and this helps him when using written methods for multiplication and division, also to work out the area and perimeter of shapes. Andrew is becoming more confident and comfortable with Mathematics as he familiarises himself with the concepts we have been exploring this semester. We have seen improvement in Andrew's ability to mentally calculate numbers during Mental Maths. Revision of basic math facts would help Andrew become more comfortable during Mental Maths and also in the manipulation of numbers to make given totals. During the unit on number facts and shapes, Andrew is showing basic understanding of problems connected with doubling and halving. Her computations aren't always consistent. Andres has excellent knowledge of 2D and 3D shapes and their properties. In our most recent unit, Andrew has shown that he has good knowledge of the tools used and the units of measure associated with it. During this semester, Andrew has also learned how to solve 2-step problems. Further practise in this area would help him become more confident in this area.

In the Human Body Unit, Andrew could list the five senses and understand the importance of keeping his body healthy. He could name the main body parts in both English and Chinese. Andrew enjoy constructing different toys from the past, particularly the Ball and Cup. He could sort old and new toys and discuss the basic differences in their construction and appearance. During the Our Home Countries unit, Andrew performed a detailed presentation on his home country, speaking clearly, confidently and with good volume in front of the audience.



Common Issues

English/EAL

- Jaime is confident to answer questions and take part in class discussions. He needs to work on listening more carefully to instructions. During class discussions he often needs to be reminded to focus on his teachers instead of his peers. This is a goal for Semester 2. Jaime reads aloud well and shows an understanding of what he has read but needs encouragement to focus and read during class. He enjoys the group reading sessions and can discuss the book, setting and characters before trying to predict what will happen next in the story. He enjoys working with others, but struggles to concentrate as well when working independently. Jaime tends to write short sentences so is being encouraged to be more descriptive in his writing and to edit his work thoroughly. His use of grammar and punctuation has really improved and we would like him to now focus on his presentation. (885)



Chinese

- Isabel has made steady progress in Chinese this semester, especially in her oral Chinese. She listens attentively and plays an active part in Chinese lessons. She has an interest in creating dialogues and actively participates in oral activities. Isabel is now able to speak and express her opinion using the correct pronunciation. She has also shown an improvement in her reading skills, although she needs to work on being louder. More reading practise may help Isabel to widen her vocabulary and enrich her imagination, so that she can use more descriptive vocabulary and language in her speaking and writing. With her continued hard work, she will continue to make further improvements in the future. (704)



Maths

- Shu Yung has a very good foundation of Mathematics skills that enables her to perform well in this subject area. She is particularly strong at multiplication and is rapidly progressing through the levels of the speed trials. Her thorough knowledge of the times tables helps her greatly in being able to make accurate and quick mental calculations. Of all the topics covered, Shu Yung initially seemed to find fractions and decimals the most challenging. She struggles to find the fraction of a whole number and converting between the two, but she certainly applied herself and was able to complete the tasks she was set with support. Shu Yung obviously enjoys Mathematics, but should ensure that she asks for help, especially when solving word problems where she may be unfamiliar with some of the English terminology. (823)

During our History and Geography units, Steven participated well in all activities and skillfully presented his project on Ancient Egypt to his peers. He draws on his wide general knowledge but needs encouragement to complete independent work in the time provided. Steven enjoyed the more practical aspects of our topics, including our investigation on air resistance using an egg and parachute. (718).
